



ISLP Poster Competition 2018–2019 Rules

Who can take part?

- Teams of 2–5 students (we do not allow posters made by only one student)
- Three divisions:
 - students born in 2002 and younger (lower secondary or upper comprehensive school)
 - students born in 1999 and younger (upper secondary school)
 - undergraduate students in university/college (Bachelor's degree students or equivalent, no age limit)
- Posters must be submitted by teachers to country coordinators for entry in National Competition (http://iase-web.org/islp/People.php?p=Country_Coordinators)
- Free entry

When?

- National competitions
 - Registration of participating students by teachers with country coordinator 1 February 2019 (at the latest)
 - Posters submitted to ISLP country coordinators country dependent
 - National winners announced 30 March 2019 (at the latest)
- International competition
 - Prizes awarded at 62nd ISI World Statistics Congress Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia 2019 18-23 August 2019

Posters

- There is no particular theme or topic required for a poster to be eligible. However, posters should reflect or illustrate usage, analysis, interpretation and communication of statistics or statistical information and findings. In planning the projects on which posters are based, it is important to take into account the judging rules of the ISLP Poster Competition, which clarify these educational goals.
- Data used can be collected by students or previously published by someone else (if the data is published, the source must be cited in the poster)
- Posters can be in any language
- Posters must be blind i.e. they must not contain any information about students or schools who have submitted them
- Posters from previous international competitions are not allowed
- Posters must be the original design and creation of students
- Posters must be two-dimensional (one single sheet) and one-sided: maximum size is A1 (841 mm x 594 mm or 33.1 in x 23.4 in) and maximum file size is 10 MB. In case of an electronic poster, the font size should be such that if it was printed in A1, it would be readable from 2 metres (7 feet) away.
- All entries become the property of the ISI and will not be returned
- Posters received after the established deadline will not be considered for the competition
- By submitting a poster, students give permission for their work to be displayed at various ISI conferences, special events, in publications and promotional material, and in electronic format on the internet
