Participation is encouraged in a variety of ways, namely by submitting your work to a Main Topic or a Contributed Paper, or to a Poster, as well as attending one of our Special Interest Group Meetings or participating in one of our Short Courses. ICOTS11 will hold sessions in three different languages, English, Spanish and Portuguese, enabling you to participate in a broader, more inclusive international forum. ## SERJ News written by Jennifer Kaplan and Jane Watson

The last year has brought important changes to SERJ as we upgrade the interface and usability of the website and streamline the publication process. SERJ is now publishing three issues per year: two for Regular papers and one Special Topics Issue. SERJ has moved on an Online Journal System (OJS) platform and is now assigning all papers DOIs on publication. All future issues will be on the site (<a href="https://iase-web.org/ojs/SERJ">https://iase-web.org/ojs/SERJ</a>) and progressively older issues will be added to the website along with DOIs for all previously published papers. As of this writing, the current issue, Volume 21, No. 1, and Issues back to Volume 16 (2017) are available on the new SERJ OJS website. Thanks go to Jennifer Kaplan (Editor) and Noleine Fitzallen (Assistant Editor) for setting up the new platform, to Gail Burrill and Daniel Frischemeier for setting up the DOIs, and to Tim Overhues, who is moving older papers over to OJS and assigning the DOIs.

Given its place in the world of academic research, SERJ is a very popular journal, with 120 submissions since 1 January 2020. The acceptance rate, under 15%, places it among the most demanding journals in the research fields of our authors.

An advertisement will go out soon for applications for Editor of SERJ starting 1 January 2023. Jennifer Kaplan has been recommended by the Advisory Board to continue as Editor through 2022. The duties of the Editor will be linked to the advertisement, and we encourage leaders in Statistics Education Research around the world to consider applying.
