### IASE 2012 ROUNDTABLE TECHNOLOGY IN STATISTICS EDUCATION: VIRTUALITIES AND REALITIES Cebu City, Philippines, July 2–6, 2012

The IASE 2012 Roundtable Conference will be held in Cebu City in the Philippines, and will bring together a group of experts, scholars, practitioners, and researchers, representing as many different countries as possible, to discuss views and approaches concerning the role of technology in statistics education. The Conference will provide opportunities for developing better mutual understanding of common problems and for making recommendations concerning the statistics curriculum. A main outcome of the Roundtable will be a monograph containing a set of high-standard reviewed papers, which have been prepared for, and discussed during, the conference.
