The 2014 Joint Statistical Meetings (JSM) was held August 2–7 at the Boston Convention and Exhibition Center with the theme “Statistics: Global Impact – Past, Present, and Future.” JSM is the largest gathering of statisticians held in North America, held jointly with the American Statistical Association, the International Biometric Society (ENAR and WNAR), the Institute of Mathematical Statistics, the Statistical Society of

Canada, the International Chinese Statistical Association, the International Indian Statistical Association, the International Society for Bayesian Analysis, the Korean International Statistical Association, and the Royal Statistical Society. Attended by over 6000 people, the meeting included oral presentations, panel sessions, poster presentations, continuing education courses, exhibit hall (with state-of-the-art statistical products and opportunities), career placement service, society and section business meetings, committee meetings, social activities, and networking opportunities.
