Delegates from 24 different countries gathered at Sasana Kijang, Kuala Lumpur from the 13th to the 16th August to participate in the IASE Satellite Conference with the broad theme *Decision Making Based on Data*. My personal thanks go to each and every one of you for responding favourably to my requests and for completing your reviews in a timely manner. The association relies on your generous spirit, which in turn enriches the quality of our papers.

My thanks also to John Shanks, webmaster for IASE websites. What an amazing job he does! His well-designed systems and processes made my life so much easier.

I feel privileged to have served the association in the role as Editor of the Proceedings, and find myself continually inspired by the work being done around the world to enhance statistics education. It was a pleasure to work with authors from 24 different countries, and to meet and interact with conference participants from around the globe.
