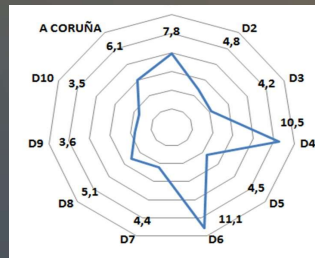

The D6 district does have a much higher density than the most populous districts of London.

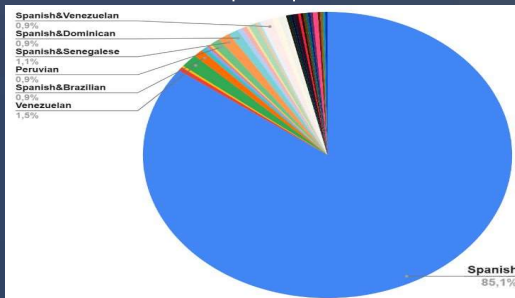

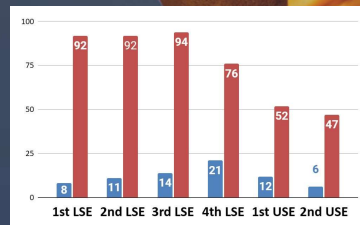
In addition, it has the **highest density** of foreign inhabitants.

Let's extrapolate the data to the school

We polled the students in our center and achieved a response rate of **91.63%**, with **471** participants. The results are as follows:



- 85.1% are Spanish nationals.
- The remaining **14.9%** hail from mostly South American and African countries with the majority coming from Venezuela.

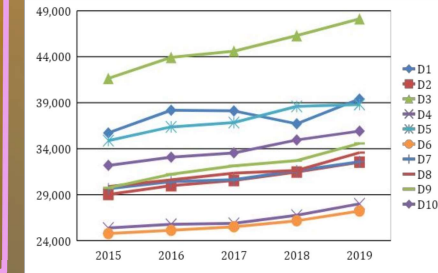


Distribution of national (red) and emigrant (blue) students per level, including Lower Secondary Education (age 12-16) and Higher Secondary Education (age 16-18).

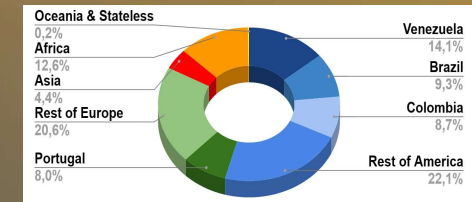
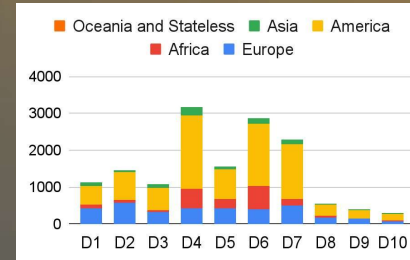

FIGURES AREN'T EVERYTHING

Among the reasons given by families for migrating, the most common ones include:

- Fleeing war
- Fleeing economic crisis
- Political persecution
- Better job opportunities
- Family already living here

Regardless of their reasons, they all have one thing in common: **they want a better life**. This is why our center is and will remain a **welcoming, multicultural, diverse** and **inclusive** hub.

We also asked how many people lived together in their homes and the most common answer was 5, hence our title: "There's always room for X... 5 more!".

CONCLUSIONS

A Coruña has a significant **foreign population**, which lives in the districts with the **lowest income** per household and the **highest population density**. **Our school is located in one of these districts**. Statistics have helped us understand both the reality in the neighborhood and in the school.

POSSIBLE IMPROVEMENTS

- Collecting more data in the survey
- Using types of statistical analysis
- Including a socio-political analysis.
