

Call for IASE Awards

The International Association for Statistical Education is pleased to announce the establishment of an IASE awards program. Three awards - Lifetime Achievement, Advocacy in Statistics Education, and Early Career - will be presented at ICOTS in 2026. Nominations for the awards are open until January 16, 2026.

The nomination packet for each award consists of the following:

- Contact information for the person being nominated and the person making the nomination as requested in the nomination form,
- A Curriculum Vitae for the nominee,
- Two letters of reference that focus primarily on the contributions of the individual, their importance, and impact,
- Description of importance and impact of the contributions (max 1000 words) explaining the contributions of the nominee to the field.

Email the completed form and related materials to Gail Burrill, Chair IASE Awards Committee at burrill@msu.edu by no later than December 15, 2025. Please note that a person cannot be nominated for more than one award by the same nominator.

The details for each award including nomination criteria are below.

Lifetime Achievement Award in Statistics Education The Award is for major contributions to the field, and the nominee's work should demonstrate a balance between statistics education research (quality/quantity of research in statistics education or mentoring of students/early career researchers) and statistics education (contributions to teaching and learning statistics, number post graduate students mentored, and/or leadership in statistics education/IASE). To be eligible for the award, the nominee must have been a member of IASE for at least five years.

- The award will be given based on evidence of the nominee's impact on applications, methodology, theory, or practice; service and/or leadership in the profession.
- Generally, the award will be given to an individual.
- The recipient must be living at the time of selection for the award.
- Each awardee will receive public recognition and a lifetime IASE membership.

Advocacy in Statistics Education The award is to recognize a statistics educator who has been at the forefront in making statistics visible and meaningful to those not in the field. To be eligible for the Award, the nominee must be a member of IASE or part of the ISLP network

- The award will be given based on evidence of the nominee's creative ways of making statistics and statistics education visible to the public and leadership in supporting ways to make statistics education more accessible to everyone.
- Generally, the award will be given to an individual.
- The recipient must be living at the time of selection for the award.

Early Career The award recognizes the work of outstanding beginning researchers in the field of statistics education for contributions to statistics education research and/or to statistics education service. To be eligible for the award, the nominee must have less than 10 years' experience as a contributor to the field since receiving his/her highest academic degree.

- The award will be based on the quality/quantity of statistics education research and contributions to statistics education
