Rules

Who can participate?

- Teams of 1-5 students (we do not allow posters made by a single student).
- Four categories:
 - A-Primary: students at age 9-12
 - B-Lower secondary: students at ages 13-15
 - C- Upper secondary: students at ages 16-18
 - D-Tertiary and/or University: Students over 18 years old, before undergraduate at university/college (currently studying, no undergraduate or postgraduate thesis allowed)
- Posters must be sent by teachers to the country coordinators in order to participate in the National Competition.

When?

National Competitions

- Posters sent to ISLP country coordinators depending on the country.
- National winners by 14 March 2027

International Competition

Winners to be announced at the 66th World Statistics Congress of the ISI in Lusaka, Zambia
11th of July 2027 – 15th of July 2027

Poster or Research Poster

- Students can choose their theme for the poster. The work should be based on the use, analysis and interpretation of statistics. When planning posters, it is important to keep in mind the judging rules of the ISLP Poster Competition.
- The data used can be collected by the students or previously published via a reliable source, for instance, the National Statistical Office. If the poster uses previously published data, the source must be cited in the poster.
- Posters can be made in the students' own language (with a translation into English attached) or in English.
- Posters must not contain information about the students or their schools (the information is provided in a separate attachment to ensure equal treatment).
- Posters from previous international competitions are not allowed.
- Posters must be the original design and created by the students.
- Posters must be two-dimensional (single sheet) and one-sided: the maximum size is A1 (841mm x 594 mm or 33.1 in x 23.4 in) and the maximum file size is 10 MB. For electronic posters, the font size should be such that if printed in A1, it would be readable from 2 metres (7 feet) away.
- All posters become the property of the ISI and ISLP and will not be returned.
- Posters received after the stated deadline will not be considered for the competition
- By submitting a poster, students give permission for their work to be displayed at the WSC conference and other special events, in publications and promotional material, and in electronic format on the Internet.
